The Needham Education Foundation (NEF) is now accepting applications for both small and large grants. All applications are due by **Tuesday**, **October 22**, **2019**. Any Needham Public School educator, administrator or community member — including students and parents — is eligible to apply. There will be two more opportunities to submit applications this year: January 21 and April 14, 2020.

- Small grants fund projects up to \$5,000
- Large grants fund projects up to \$15,000

Within small grants, the NEF offers two additional options:

- Express grants allow applicants to apply for a program already funded by the NEF at another school
- Multi-School grants allow schools to apply together without the constraints of the small grant funding limit (up to \$3,000 per school)
