Principal's News:

ORGANIC RECYCLING PROGRAM

Starting late next week, Eliot School will be the first in the district to pilot an Organic Recycling Program during lunch time. When it's time to dispose of waste, students will have four options: They will put liquids in a bucket, paper and plastics in a blue recycling bin, food waste in a green bin and other trash in a black trash bin. The recycling will be sent to the town recycling center and the food waste will be sent to a company that will turn it into energy. The best part of the program is that Eliot students will no longer have their lunches served on styrofoam trays but on compostable paper trays. We are so thrilled to be on the path to become Needham's first "Zero Waste" School!

SPOTLIGHT ON 4TH GRADE

Fourth grade has been working on writing opinion essays. This month, students in Mr. Kerr, Ms. Kozin, and Ms. Westphalen's class are learning about the best way to share strong opinions. This six-week unit will end with students publishing essays that will convince readers to agree using strong arguments and data to support their statements.

To create the pieces of writing, students began by collecting ideas of what they love in the world and what drives them crazy. Then, they brainstormed different reasons they feel that way. Fourth graders are currently preparing their arguments with a goal of providing lots of strong evidence to support their opinions. At the end of the process, students will share their work with our class communities and stakeholders such as building administrators. Students look forward to sharing their strong opinions and perhaps change an opinion in the process.

MCAS DATE CHANGE

There is a slight adjustment to the MCAS dates in the spring. Fourth graders will take the test on April 14 and April 16th. The change was made to accommodate the STMath Conference Eliot is hosting on the 15th for Massachusetts educators. We are honored to host this conference to demonstrate the innovative math program used by Eliot students in grades K-2. December: ¡Feliz año nuevo! Happy New Year! Hope you all had a restful, relaxing break. Here is what we did in Spanish class during the month of December.

Kindergarteners are getting really good at saying how they feel, as well as recognizing colors and numbers in Spanish. We are talking about the calendar, and are continuing to work with animals and what they need to live as well. Ask your kindergartener to show you what we have been working on in class!

First graders worked on numbers, the days of the week, and weather in Spanish during December. Ask them to tell you about the weather outside in Spanish!

Second graders talked about what they were thankful for in the month of December, and also reviewed the weather and seasons in Spanish, so ask your second grader to tell you about the weather outside!

Third graders finished up with the unit on fruits and vegetables and took a checkin to show what they know, so ask them about it if you haven't seen it already. They also learned about food in Mexico as that is our country study this year in third grade, so have your third grader tell you something about what they learned!

Fourth graders finished up with the unit on school, and will share something with parents, so look for them to bring it home soon. We also talked about New Year celebrations around the world, and compared them to our traditions.
