#### FOCUS ON KINDNESS

### From our Principal, Mrs. Bourn

This year, the Eliot school will focus on how to be kind to their classmates, teachers and our school community. Over the summer the school invested in an updated Social Emotional Curriculum called Second Step. The curriculum uses age appropriate student conflict scenarios to teach problem solving, empathy, and emotion management. This program will enhance Social Emotional learning in addition to anti bullying lessons and Eagles Nest lessons with the guidance staff. Teachers began training for the program prior to the start of school and will discuss how to implement lessons as part of our school wide professional development. Lessons will begin the first week of October.

To kick off our focus on kindness, the students heard the story, Be Kind by Pat Zietlow Miller at the all school assembly. The book was about a child trying to figure out ways to be kind to her classmate Tanisha, after an embarrassing moment in class. The book provides simple ways to be kind such as saying "Thank you," and using a person's name. It is our hope that these efforts will build a strong foundation for how we treat each other here at Eliot school.

#### SPOTLIGHT ON FIRST GRADE

First Grade made their mark at the Eliot School! Inspired by Peter Reynold's book The Dot, each first grader made their own special and unique dot design. The main character in this story was challenged by her teacher to "make her mark" through art and self discovery. 
