#### THANKSGIVING BREAK

As a reminder, students do not have school on Wednesday, November 21st. On that day, teachers will participate in professional development to help deepen our understanding of culturally proficient practices.

Around this time of year staff and students take pause and reflect on being thankful. Personally, I am so very thankful to have the opportunity to serve as principal of this remarkable school community. I hope everyone has a wonderful Thanksgiving and families get an opportunity to reconnect and celebrate together.

### SPOTLIGHT ON 5TH GRADE

Fifth grade is hard at work diving into learning across the curriculum. Students are finishing up our first Book Clubs and getting ready to learn about many very important people by reading biographies. In writing, they are finishing their Personal Narrative stories and beginning their study and writing of Literary Essays. In math they have been exploring decimal place value and added exponential form to their repertoire of ways to express numbers. Did you know that you can write 1,000,000 as 106 ? 5th graders are also learning about the beginnings of our country and the events that led to the American Revolution and our independence from Great Britain. Finally, in Science they have been learning about animal classification and some of the magnification tools scientists use to study specimens. Attached are some pictures of our fifth grade readers, writers, mathematicians, historians and scientists.

#### SEARCHING FOR HOST FAMILIES FOR CHINESE STUDENTS

For the 8th consecutive year, Needham families will have an opportunity to host elementary and middle school age students from our sister schools in Beijing, China! This year, we are trying to find host families for 25 students between the ages of ten and twelve years old.

We've learned much from our previous exchanges, and the process has become smoother and more rewarding each time! This year's visiting students will arrive in Boston on December 1st and will stay at the homes of Needham host families from Sunday afternoon on December 2 through Monday morning on December 10.

We are asking for families to participate in this program by opening their homes and welcoming these children. If room is available, some families in the past have found it helpful to take in two students. Some students are often more comfortable when they are paired with a friend.

Because of the relatively short notice, we would appreciate knowing if you could host children as soon as possible.

There is an informational meeting for families that are committed to hosting students on Tuesday, November 27 at 6:30pm in the High Rock Media Center. Ying Liu and Wendy Wu, representatives from the sponsoring agency, Boston Ivy, will be on hand to share information and answer questions. Former and repeating host families will be there as well to share their past experiences.

### Some helpful information:

Chinese students have a various degree of competence in English.

We have set up communication tools to assist both host families and visiting children.

Boston Ivy staff are available around the clock for any medical or emergency issue.

There will be administrators and teachers from the children's school staying in a nearby hotel.

All students have health insurance and will have money for purchasing souvenirs.

Chinese students will ride the bus to and from school with the host family child if the host family uses the transportation service.

The town provides lunch at school for the Chinese students and will receive a temporary PIN number for the cafeteria.

There will be a database set up so multiple host families can connect in order to plan outings or social connections.

It is not expected that you go out of your way to entertain these students. The main goals of their visit are to experience our culture and improve their English.

This program is one of a kind in Massachusetts (and probably the country) and it takes a village to keep it going! Please consider hosting a student or two. It will be a most enriching and memorable experience for your family and the student.

Again, we ask that you inform your building principal, Karen Bourn if you will host students by as soon as possible. Please let them know how many students you will host and your gender preference. If you have any questions, please contact the main office for assistance.

### VACATIONS

The Needham Public Schools discourages families from taking unauthorized school vacations. School policy dictates that teachers will not provide children with work before they leave for a vacation while school is in session. There is good reason for this. To do so trivializes teaching and what goes on in each classroom. Concepts are presented to students and homework is based on what is taught in class. Teachers cannot predict in advance where students will be in the learning process. When your child returns to school, the work missed will be given to your child. Together, you and your child can complete it. If you must travel, your children should continue to read daily and write in a travel journal.

During the sometimes stormy New England winter, it is the goal of the Superintendent to hold school whenever possible. Parents and students should plan accordingly and leave plenty of time on winter mornings to arrive at school safely. However, there may be occasions when deteriorating weather will mean that schools should close due to unsafe conditions.

After reviewing anticipated road and sidewalk conditions, access to our schools, the projected weather forecast, and consultation with the Needham Police and the Department of Public Works, the Superintendent will make a determination between approximately 5:00 and 6:00 a.m. whether conditions will be safe for the children to come to school. The following plans will be in effect for inclement weather:

#### No School Announcement

If the conditions are severe, school will be canceled. The Needham Public Schools will utilize an emergency notification system that will contact your home phone, cell phones, and send an email using the information you have updated in PowerSchool. The "No School" announcement will also be carried by television channels 4, 5, 7, and FOX25, and the local cable channel. Information regarding schools during inclement weather is also prominently displayed on the Needham Public Schools' website <u>www.needham.k12.ma.us</u>. The quickest way to find out is on Twitter where I also post the information. (For more info: <u>https://twitter.com/@NPS\_Supt</u>)

- All classes and school activities will be canceled for the day, including scheduled adult evening classes, before and after school programs, including Needham Extended Day Program (NEDP), and other school-based activities.
- Transportation of students to out-of-district schools will be canceled on Needham's "No School" days.

# Parents <u>may opt out</u> of the emergency notification system for weather related events only:

1. Please log onto PowerSchool and click on Update Information.

2. On the Student Data Update page, delete the telephone number in the field marked *Weather Related School Delays/Cancellations Phone.* 

3. You will receive calls for other school emergencies. Alternatively, you may change the number in that box to a phone number more convenient to you and your family.

4. Contact the school secretary if you have a problem with your PowerSchool account.

#### **Two-Hour Delayed Opening Announcement**

If the Department of Public Works needs extra time to plow the roads or sand the streets to assure safety, the school day will be shortened. Under this alternative plan, the opening of school and all bus pickups will be delayed two hours. This includes special education transportation pick-ups for students in out-of-district schools. The "Two-Hour Delayed Opening" announcement will be the same as for school closure. Parents are reminded not to send their children to school early on "Two-Hour Delayed Opening" days since the school yards may not be plowed nor will staff be available to supervise early arrivals.

#### On "Two-Hour Delayed Opening" days:

- Schools will be dismissed at their regular times.
- Noon meal will be served at the regular times in all school cafeterias.
- Kindergarten a.m. session and Preschool a.m. sessions: canceled
- KASE a.m. session: Hillside and Broadmeadow canceled; Eliot, Mitchell and Newman 2-hour delay
- All KASE p.m. sessions will be held at their regularly scheduled times.
- Needham Extended Day Program (NEDP) before-school program will be closed; all afterschool programs will be open.

#### **Emergency Early Release Announcement**

In the event of a severe weather emergency or some other emergency that develops during the school day, the Needham Public Schools may release students before the end of the school day. We will use the emergency notification system to alert parents and guardians. As appropriate, the Needham Public Schools will work with public safety officials to shelter students we are unable to send home.
