GENERIC MINISTRY AND SANDWICH TUESDAYS

For the past 10 years, students at Eliot school have teamed up with the Generic Ministry to provide basic necessities and food for the homeless in Boston. Every week, the generic ministry van delivers much needed supplies. Students at Eliot participate in 6 of those deliveries by collecting items such as socks, deodorant, toothpaste, water, sneakers, toiletries, warm clothing and of course, sandwiches. Prior to the deliveries, students will gather in the cafeteria and create sandwiches and bagged meals. All students in grades K-5 will have an opportunity to participate in this activity. We are very proud of our student's efforts and the kindness they show to those in need.

DECEMBER ALL SCHOOL MEETING

On Wednesday, we gathered in the performance center for our monthly all school meeting. As usual, our meeting began with the "All together again" song accompanied by Mrs. Wankowicz on the piano. After the introductory song, there was a quick presentation by Kristen Collins from the Generic ministry to discuss how our efforts help others in the community. Later, Mrs. Wankowicz acknowledged student artists, Molly Spear in grade 3 and Sailor Wachter in grade 4. Their artwork is displayed just outside the performance center. THE HOUR OF CODE AT ELIOT

The Hour of Code started as a one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to demystify "code", to show that anybody can learn the basics, and to broaden participation in the field of computer science. It has since become a worldwide effort to celebrate computer science, starting with 1-hour coding activities but expanding to all sorts of community efforts. This grassroots campaign is supported by over 400 partners and 200,000 educators worldwide.

What is the Hour of Code at Eliot School?

It is an introductory exploration activity for all students, kindergarten through

5th grade. Students will work on a variety of coding activities in the technology center with their classroom teacher and the instructional technology specialist.

The hour of code is also an effort to demystify code, and change the conversation around computer science.

Why Computer Science?

Computer programming jobs are growing 3x faster than students entering the field. Yet fewer schools teach computer science than 10 years ago. 90% of K-12 schools in the United States don't even teach it. Visit http://hourofcode.com to learn more.

Who is behind this campaign?

Apple, Microsoft, Google, Amazon, the Boys and Girls Clubs, the College Board, Bill Gates, Mark Zuckerberg, and over 100 others, are uniting to back the Hour of Code campaign. The Computing in the Core Coalition and Code.org are organizing CSEdWeek 2018. The annual CSEdWeek celebrates the birthday of computing pioneer Admiral Grace Murray Hopper (December 9, 1906).

This past week, Kathy Martell our instructional technology teacher met with with each class to explore coding at various developmental levels. Kindergarten students programmed BeeBots, 1st and 2nd graders explored Block Coding, and 3-5 worked with the Scratch Program and writing codes. There will be an extension opportunities for students ready to face new challenges. Thank you Ms. Martell for the productive and fun week.

T= turtle, token, etc.


